We replaced several transmitters, one was due to rodents eating through the wires, two were older 1" meters with bad batteries. Meters were read and we investigated several high usages, and non-reading meters.

We went on several calls for leaks on meter connections. A new well pump and motor was delivered.

April 2026 Sewer Report

Took apart one of the compressors for the sand filters due to over pressurizing. Found that the pressure switch was full of water. Cleaned out the line of water and reinstalled the pressure switch. The compressor is functioning correctly again.

Pulled apart one of the pumps at Pump Station A, the pump was full of rags. Cleaned out the rags and then reassembled the pump, the pump was back to normal operation afterwards.

Fixed two broken chains that were in Cell 1 from over the winter. The connecting hose on one of the chains had broken causing air to leak, the other had the chain broken that keeps the hose in place.

Emptied and cleaned out the Chlorine Crock. Refilled with new chlorine afterwards.

The company that cleans the grease and rags out of pump station B came. They were able to get the pit cleaned out very well, while the pit was clean and empty, we did a visual inspection on the condition of the pit and saw that everything was in good shape. We should be good for another year until we need to have the pit cleaned out again.

Warren County Urban Garden Initiative Grant

Warrensburch Beautification has once again been approved to receive a grant from WCSWCD for our Community Garden. \$500 was approved for amended soil and hemlock boards to rebuild raised beds that are in need of repair. The funding will restore nutrients in the soil in the beds and pollinator hedge row, and allow all of the beds to be adopted. We will also be supplied with peas and oats cover crop seeds to enrich the soil later in the season.

Ag Literacy in the Classroom/Ag Literacy Week Sponsored by CCE of Warren County

On March 19th Beautification was welcomed back to the Elementary School, reading to the Second Grade Classes, and having activities that teach them about local agriculture. The book chosen, "*Seasons on the Farm*", focused the children on the events that each season brings to the farm. The fun activity was creating a Seasons Wheel, where the children drew a memorable activity on the wheel for each season.

Pick Up Warrensburg

This is a new initiative of Warrensburch Beautification Inc. **Mission:** to reduce litter through various strategies including community involvement and organizational support, with a focus on creating awareness, changing behaviors and putting litter in its place. **Goals:** 1. Keep our streets clean by properly disposing of litter, 2. Show respect for our neighbors by maintaining our home and property, 3. Display a "Pick Up Warrensburg" sticker to remind visitors that we care about our community. Rack cards and stickers will be available at the Town Hall, Richards Library, Warrensburch Museum of Local History and Warren County CCE.
