Blueberry Festival

Our Fifth Annual Blueberry Festival on July 19th brought our blueberry lovers from near and far! Thank you to all those who donated dishes for our Sampling Table and to our community and visitors who came out to support our local businesses. Cornell Cooperative Extension recipes were distributed at our Master Gardener Station as well as horticultural information on how to grow your own. Children's events included blueberry themed crafts for the children were provided by Richards Library and face painting by Megan Pierce. Our vendors picked up on the theme and featured locally grown berries and blueberry infused beverages, preserves, cheeses, pies, cookies and other sweets. Once again, a big "Thank You" to the Town of Warrensburg for offering us the Recreation Field Pavilion for our festivals with ample parking for our vendors and customers.

AARCH Tour – Warrensburgh: High Style Architecture and Grassroots Preservation SOLD OUT! Adirondack Architectural Heritage, working with our organization, sponsored a tour starting at our Museum of Local History (Laura Moore) and included six locations: Davidson House (Manu Davidson), Historic Shirt Factory (Tom Grace), Emerson House (Ken and Denise Geiger), Woodward Block (Julie Garcia), Bandstand Brew Works (Darby & Laurie Langworthy, Adam & Brooke Langworthy) and Cornerstone Victorian Bed & Breakfast (Jay & Brittni Zimmerman). Sandi Parisi and Delbert Chambers provided both historical and architectural information about the Town in general and the individual properties. The property owners shared their own stories of preservation work, success with the NYS Historic Homeowners Tax Credit Program, and the appreciation they have for the solid construction and architectural features of their properties. Over thirty people from Plattsburgh to Albany came to our hamlet, were engaged and truly seemed to enjoy learning about our local history and all the architectural styles our community has to offer. I shared the story of how our Architectural Heritage Committee began to create awareness of our historic resources in 1994 by creating a tour guide, which led to an almost decade long effort working with the NYS Office of Historic Preservation to list the Hamlet of Warrensburgh Historic District (over 225 properties) on both the State and National Registers of Historic Places in 2000 and 2001 - still the largest district in the Adirondack Park!
