January SEWER REPORT 2023

THE TWO PUMPS AT PUMP STATION A WERE NOT OPERATING CORRECTLY. WE OPENED THEM UP AND FOUND RAGS IN BOTH PUMPS. WE CHECK THE FLAPPER VALVE TO MAKE SURE IT WAS WORKING PROPERLY. PUMP STATION C CALLED OUT FOR HIGHWATER. WE BACK FLUSHED BOTH PUMPS AND CLEARED ANY DEBRIS IN THE PUMPS.

WE LOST A COMPRESSOR THAT OPERATES THE SAND FILTERS. ATLAS COPCO CMAE AN DIAGNOSED THE PROBLEM AND RECOMMENDED THAT DUE TO THE AGE AND COST OF REPAIR THAT WE SHOULD REPLACE IT AND WE ARE WAITING ON A QUOTE.
