We shut water off for repairs at several customers, replaced two frostplates, and did some other repairs to meters.

On March 10th we had a water main break on Catherine Street that involved repairing the line and repairing a valve.

On March 13th we had a well pump break down, we called Rosicks Well Drilling to install our pump and motor.

Meters were read this month and we helped people out on high usages.

Cedarwood Engineering has submitted plans to Dept. of Health to install a 4 inch line on Jenni Jill Loop, this is part of the WIA grant, and is needed to replace a one inch line that is not providing enough water for the homes.

April 2025 Sewer Report

We have found a new method to loosen the sand in the sand filters by attaching air directly to the bottom of the filter rather than our traditional lancing we have done in the past. This new method seems to loosen the sand quicker and clean the sand faster. We will be continuing to use this method in the future.

During routine inspection, it was found that the belts on the compressor that supply air to the sand filters were worn and missing multiple teeth in multiple sections, we have replaced the belts.

The new quarterly testing began this month, it went very well with instructions provided by our Water department and our representative for New York Rural Water.

We located and marked our sewer lateral on Third street for the homeowner that is going to be hooking into our system.

Winchip door fixed our garage door at Pump station A, they replaced pulleys, cables and the lock cylinder.

Congratulations to Jeremy Scroggins for passing his sewer plant operator's license.
