The court also adjourned the case from 6 Marion Ave as the party was said to be in Albany Med.

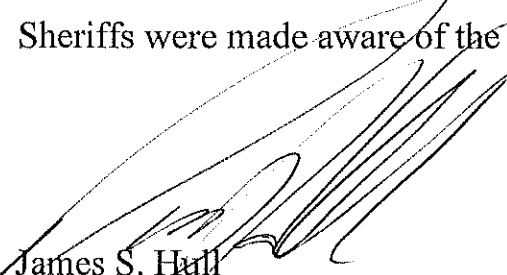
Sent a warning notice to 9 Robin Drive for grass over height.

Report Details:

I issued 1 septic and 8 Land Use & Development permits in the month of June.

The Planning Board nor the Zoning Board have meetings this month due to lack of applications for them.

We did just receive an application for site plan review for a 4-lot campground at 250 Schroon River Rd., which will be on August's Planning Board agenda.

July 2026 Sewer Report

Adjusted our Chlorine mix for our sand filters to better accommodate the higher demand we are experiencing so far this year. The new mix is helping keep algae at bay.

The company that deals with our UV system came out to diagnosis an issue we were having with a control board failure. The tech was here for the day and helped with a couple of issues we were also having and found that our control board was the issue. The tech reported back to the office, and they are shipping out a new board as a warranty replacement.

Received a call for no power at Pump station C on the weekend. The guy on-call arrived and found that there was indeed no power, Tracy arrived and found we had lost one leg of our three-phase power. National Grid responded quickly and fixed the issue; power was restored the same day.

County home pump station called out for high motor temp, when we arrived the pump was pumped down lower than its normal threshold. Found the high-water float had been caught in the on position, not allowing the pumps to turn off. The float was readjusted and working properly afterwards.

Started working on getting the manholes ready for the upcoming paving projects in town.

July 2026 Water Report

Water was shut off so homeowners could repair their water line, we repaired the curb shut off at that time. We shut off at another home so they could put a new main shutoff in. The meter was reinstalled, and water was turned on at several homes.

On June 18th a storm came through knocking down trees, power was lost at the well houses, power was restored later in the evening. On June 22nd a VFD that operates a well pump failed, a new one is ordered, but we are running on only three wells. I have instituted a sprinkler restriction due to the high usage and lack of a well pump to keep up. There shall only be two hours of sprinkling a day.
